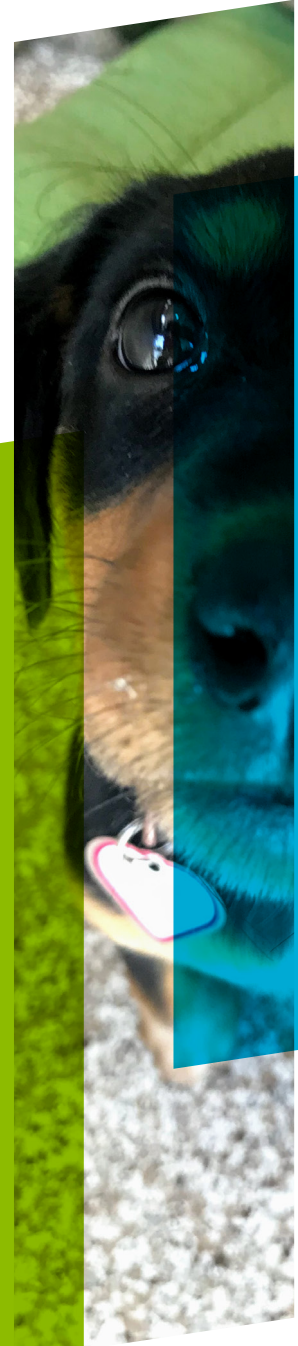
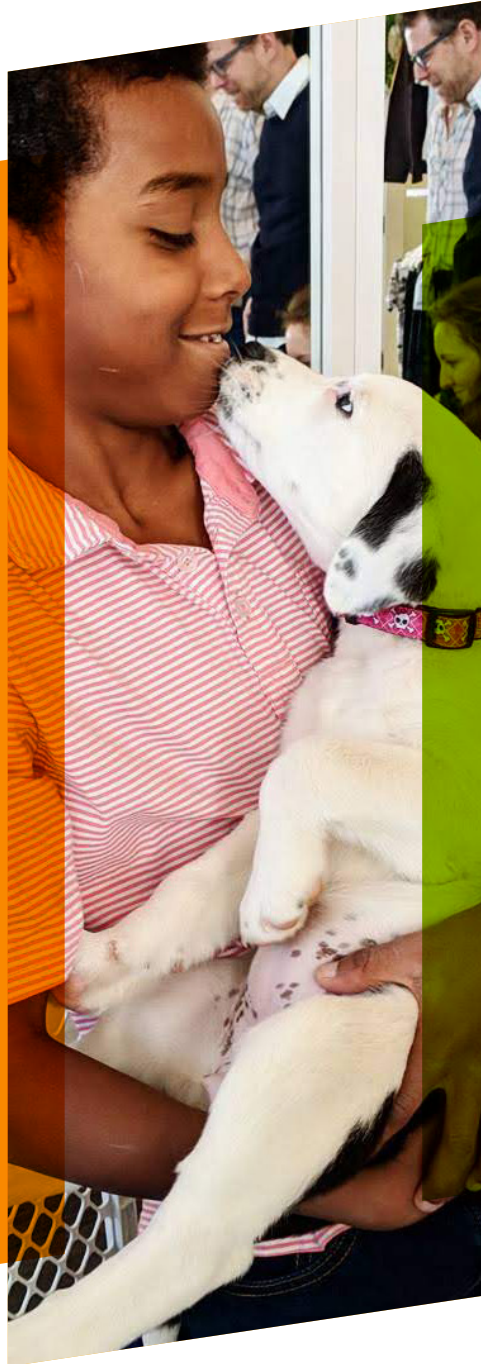

Dear Supporters,

We are humbled by your generosity and overwhelmed with gratitude to share with you the work of the Humane Society of Boulder Valley as Co-Chairs of the Board of Directors. In 2019, the incredible commitment of our staff, volunteers, donors, and community members ensured a year of lifesaving endeavors as we bid farewell to long-time CEO, Lisa Pedersen, and welcomed back Jan McHugh-Smith, CAWA, as our new CEO. Jan's decades of accomplishments as a nationally-renowned animal welfare professional made her well suited to build upon Lisa's legacy and HSBV's mission: to continue to make a lifesaving difference for animals in need and a life-changing impact for their families.

Last year, nearly 6,500 vulnerable animals found kindness, love, and individualized care from the moment they walked through HSBV's doors. Thousands received lifesaving medical care and behavioral support as they awaited new families. Both our Shelter Medicine and Behavior Modification programs remained busy providing intensive resources to shelter pets – including dogs and cats from within our community, as well as animals with complex conditions from neighboring communities and states. HSBV's Transfer program saved the lives of 2,600 dogs and cats, while providing relief for our animal welfare partners who recognize HSBV as a lifesaving destination.

Even more, our programs continue to uncover ways to keep pets with their loving families and out of the shelter. Whether it was during personal crises, financial hardship, natural disasters, or medical emergencies, HSBV's Safety Net program provided emergency boarding, discounted behavioral and medical care, and free pet food and supplies to thousands of families in 2019 – impacting more animals and people than ever before. When we care for people, we care for pets – and together, we are ensuring a bright future for everyone who calls Boulder Valley home.

We really are better together.

Your commitment to our mission and its evolution inspires all of us at HSBV. In 2020 and beyond, we look forward to continuing to grow our Safety Net of care until everyone finds equal access to the lifelong, loving bond of a pet. We thank you for saving lives and for being our partner in sustaining life-changing relationships by supporting pets and the people who love them.

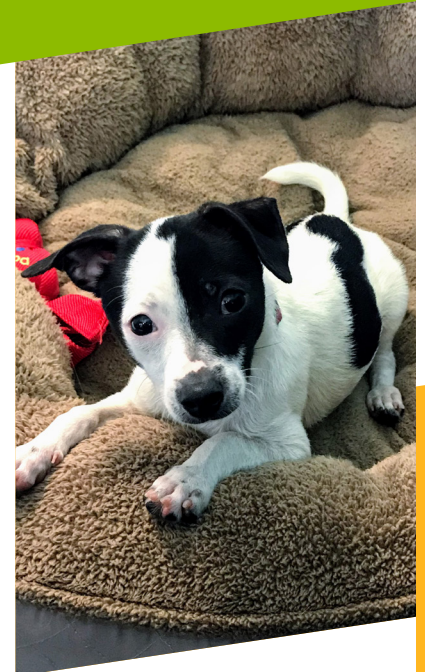

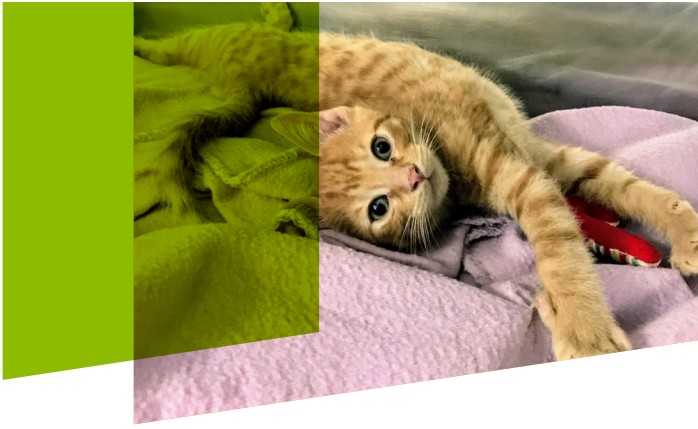

Pets AND People

The Humane Society of Boulder Valley provides lifesaving and life-changing care to pets in need and pet guardians in our community, and partners with animal and human service organizations across our state and region to provide compassionate care and expert resources to everyone who comes through our doors. Every day, our staff and volunteers work to build, enrich, and strengthen relationships between pets and people. Last year, close to 5,000 animals found loving families of their own through our adoption program. Nearly 700 lost and stray animals were safely reunited with their families through our lost and found services.

Fostering richer and stronger bonds with their pets, over 3,000 guardians utilized the reward-based, force-free training services of our Training and Behavior Center. Our Veterinary Clinic continued to ensure the health of over 6,000 pets, providing families with resources so their pets can live long, happy lives. The collaborative efforts of our Safety Net program strengthened and supported vulnerable pet-guardian relationships by providing over 1,200 appointments to ensure families had access to veterinary care for their beloved pets, housing 67 pets for families experiencing crises or emergencies, extending training and behavior resources to 48 animals, and supplying more than 25,000 meals for pets. Companion animals bring joy and love into the lives we share with them. **Through these life-changing relationships, our lives are enriched and our community thrives.**



Barkley

A Community Safety Net

Barkley's guardian turned to HSBV for help when she discovered a large mass on his neck. Unable to afford his treatment, she feared her only option would be to relinquish Barkley to HSBV so he could receive care he desperately needed. Thanks to your community support of the HSBV Safety Net program, Barkley's guardian was able to rely on our Veterinary Clinic's Medical Access Fund — a discount program and custom payment plan to help families facing urgent veterinary situations. After our veterinary team removed Barkley's mass, we gave him medication to help his recovery, and thanks to you, we were able to reunite him with his lifelong guardian.

Your inspiring dedication to supporting the life-changing bonds we share with our pets ensures families have access to veterinary care when finances are tight, free pet food, supplies, and boarding when facing hardship and crisis, and access to behavior care so these loving relationships can last a lifetime.

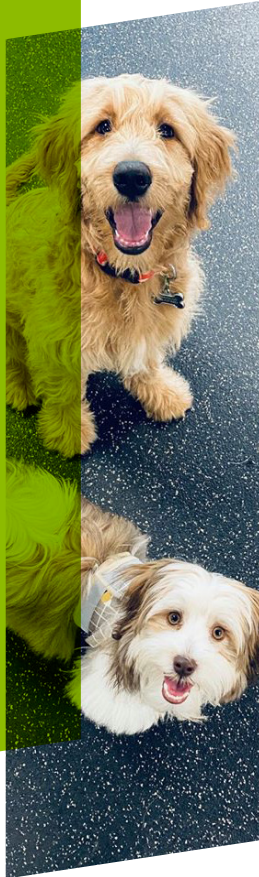
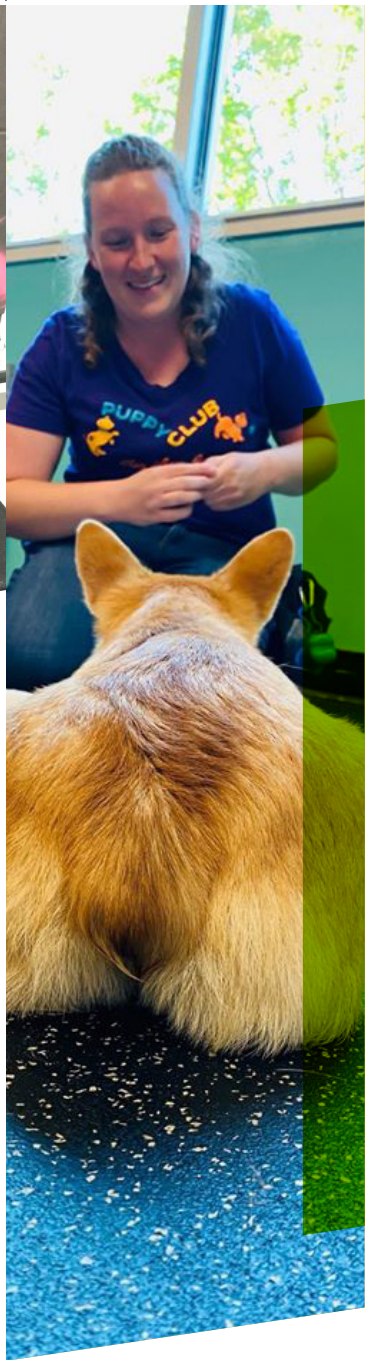
Thanks to your support, in 2019, our lifesaving work continued to evolve, meeting complex and emerging needs of the animals at HSBV and our community.

A Positive Start in Puppy Club

The launch of our drop-off-training and comprehensive socialization program, Puppy Club, for puppies up to the age of six months, has been more than we could've ever hoped. Our new day-training program offers methodical, reward-based training and exposure for puppies between 8 and 16 weeks of age. Our goal is to prevent behavior problems from emerging later in life by positively exposing puppies to a variety of novel stimuli. Our classes have been filled to the brim, and our curriculum adapts to each groups' size, age range, and socialization levels. This gentle, encouraging approach yields incredible results – learning to master stairs or an elevator, comfortably approaching children, relaxation during thunderstorms, and more! Thanks to you – our training team is leveraging their expertise to ensure the puppies of our community grow into happy and healthy adult dogs.

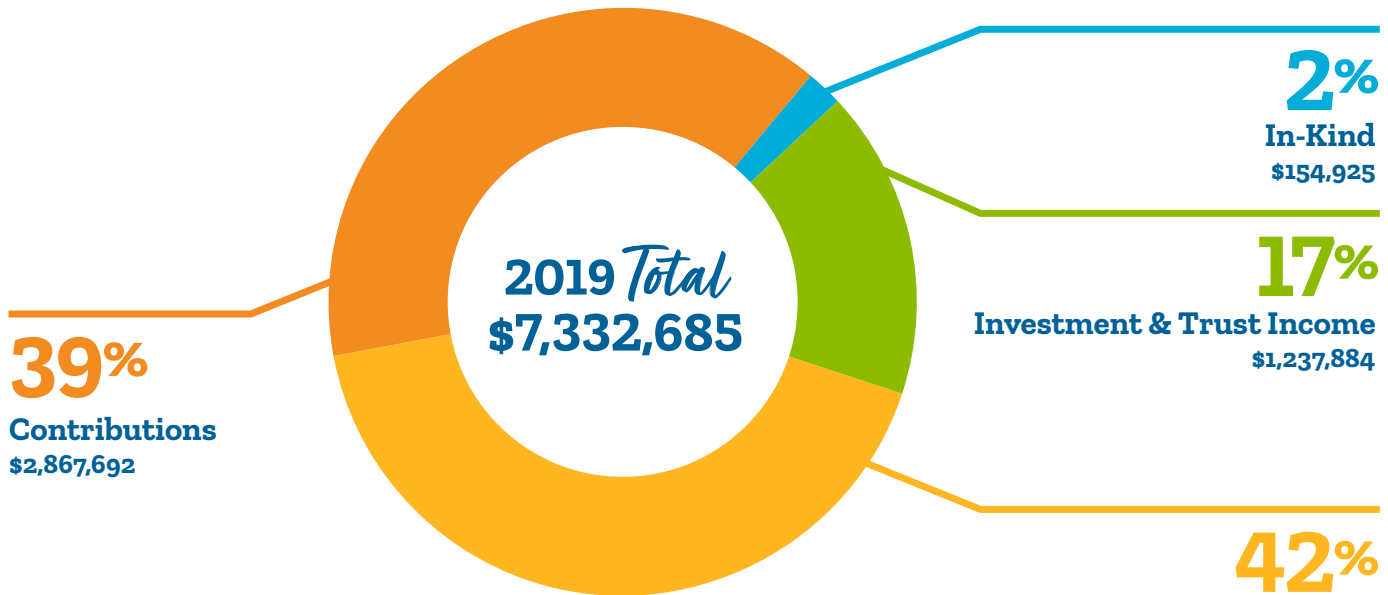
Growing the Collaborative Landscape of Shelter Medicine + Behavior Modification

Each year, 900 animals receive behavior modification support to help them overcome obstacles, build confidence, and live happy lives. As a transfer destination for many animal shelters in our state and region, and an open-admission facility for pets of our community, HSBV serves animals with significant social and behavioral deficits, requiring intensive behavior and veterinary care. Through our collaborative efforts, HSBV's team of veterinarians and training and behavior staff worked together to develop care plans by pairing pharmaceutical treatments with behavior modification plans. Animals enrolled in these treatment plans receive individualized care, and post-adoption support to help them transition into loving homes, and succeed in their new lives. As cases are studied, our staff teams learn and adapt treatment plans for future animals, adopted pets thrive with their new families, and HSBV continues to be an innovative partner for neighboring organizations relying on us to give animals a second chance. Thanks to you, animals get their second chances, families grow, and love thrives.



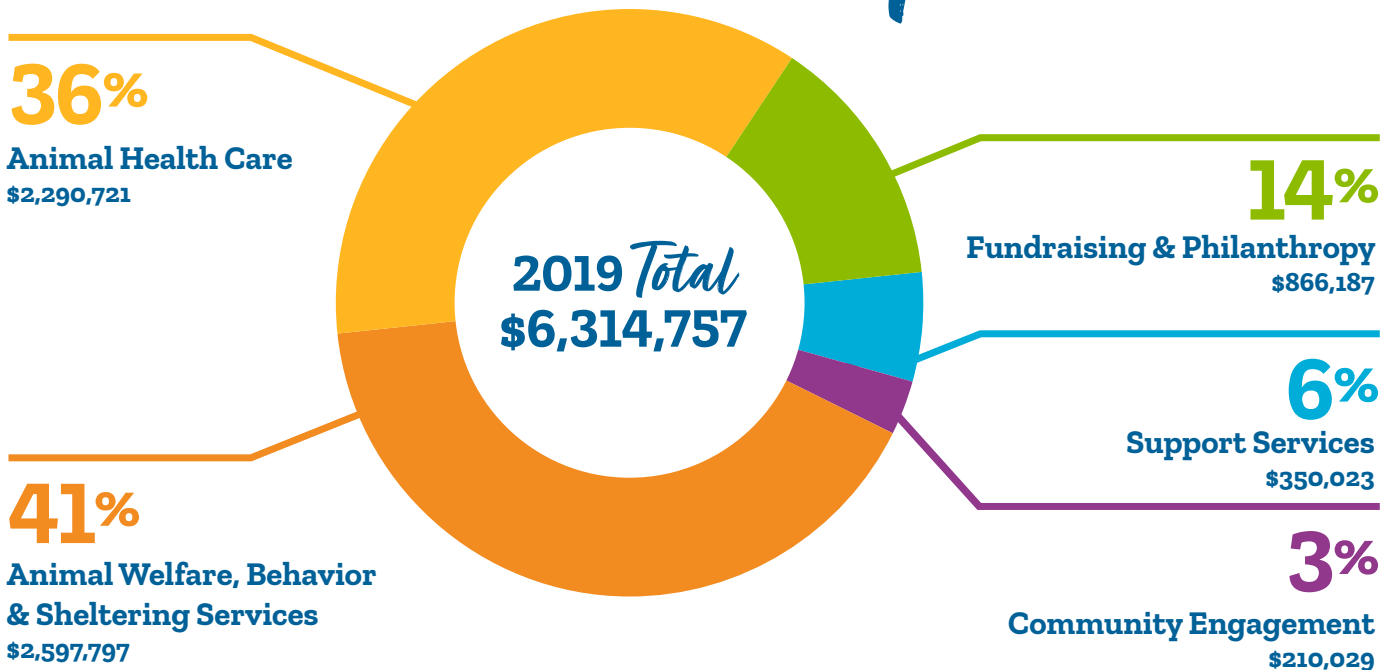
