
Meet Kat

Buzz arrived at HSBV in desperate need of help and hope. Diagnosed with hypothyroidism, Buzz's skin and ears were red and itchy from infection. He'd lost fur in multiple places, leaving him uncomfortable and exposed. To make matters worse, a heavy benign growth was causing him constant discomfort. It's difficult for us to imagine how he felt carrying that weight around.

Behind his sad eyes, we knew this was a special boy ready for a new lease on life.

Our dedicated veterinarians created a treatment plan for Buzz's hypothyroidism and worked with our friends at Flatirons Natural Pet to give him a much-needed spa day! Feeling better, Buzz underwent surgery to remove the growth that had been such a burden.

Now Buzz couldn't be happier! His fur is growing back healthy and he's full of joy with his newfound freedom from discomfort. He especially loves rolling around in the grass and feeling the sun on his belly.

YOUR GENEROSITY GAVE HER A SECOND CHANCE

At HSBV, we see many vulnerable animals come through our doors. But every now and then, there's a story that grabs ahold of your heart and refuses to let go. That was the case with a little seven-year-old dog we've named Holly.

A good Samaritan found and brought sweet Holly to our shelter for help. Blind and in pain, she still managed a weak wag of her tail and leaned in for pets when she heard our voices — a testament to her incredible spirit.

After a thorough examination, our veterinarians discovered she needed multiple surgeries just to have a fighting chance at a pain-free life. Our hospital went to work right away. During her first surgery, they removed an entire mammary chain due to tumors and spayed her.

Holly also needed both of her eyes removed due to severe glaucoma, her other mammary chain removed and dentistry care.

It was a lot for such a small body to endure, but Holly was determined to fight.

We needed your help to give Holly the surgeries and critical medical care she needed for a chance at a happy, healthy future. Thanks to your incredible generosity, her surgeries were successful, and she's bravely adjusting to life without her sight. It's a testament to her spirit and we're overjoyed to share that she has been adopted and is enjoying her new life and family!
