Disaster Ready:

Protect Your Pets, Plan Ahead!

Disasters are unpredictable. Your pet's safety doesn't have to be. Here are some tips to help you and your family – including your pets – plan and prepare now!

Build a Pet Disaster Preparedness Plan

Things to include:

- Have an evacuation plan for your pet. Determine a safe place where you can take
 your pets before disasters and emergencies happen. Your local animal shelter
 may offer temporary housing during a disaster. Find a pet-friendly hotel, or
 friend who will welcome you and your animals.
- Develop a buddy system. Plan with neighbors, friends or relatives to make sure that someone is available to care for, or evacuate, your pets if you cannot. Consider connecting through the free Pet Help & Rescue app (phar.org) for a neighbors-based emergency alert and communication tool.
- Have your pet microchipped. Make sure to keep your address and phone number up to date on your microchip registration and include contact information for an emergency contact outside of your immediate area.

Build an evacuation "Go Bag" with essentials like:

- Food and water
- Pet carrier
- Pet prescriptions
- Bowls
- Leash and collar
- Vaccination records
- Photo of you and your pet for ID
- Poop bags/cat litter and litter box

When Frisco first arrived at HSBV last fall, he was extremely fearful and struggling to find his place in the world. His body language told us he was scared, and he was struggling to adapt to his new environment. Our teams were determined to help Frisco overcome his fears, learn to navigate his new world and find his new family.

For months, our training and behavior, shelter and veterinary teams worked collaboratively, using compassionate, fear-free techniques to help Frisco feel safe. Soon, our teams discovered one special key to his heart: Frisco loved treats! We included delicious treats in every interaction, slowly building tiny bridges of trust and teaching Frisco that the best was still to come.

This tireless work wasn't without some extra help. For Frisco, a breakthrough came in the most unexpected form: Crunchwrap, a tiny chihuahua! Sweet Frisco seemed to have a soft spot for puppies and smaller dogs. This unusual, but oh-so-adorable, friendship helped Frisco's confidence grow as he played with his new little friend.

Today, we're ecstatic to share with you, that after 160 days in our shelter – having made so much progress – Frisco was adopted into a loving home, where he is now living his very best life – a testament to the lifesaving power made possible by your incredible support!

A New Beginning:

How One Small Kitten Inspired Our Community

Rosemary, a newborn kitten, was found cold and alone, abandoned in a stairwell in our community. Just a few hours old, her tiny cries were barely heard when an animal protection officer found her. She was weak, dehydrated and scared, her future hanging by a thread.

Our dedicated veterinary team worked around the clock to keep Rosemary alive, cleaning, feeding, and warming her tiny body. She arrived freezing, but thanks to dedicated care, she recovered beautifully and is now flourishing in a loving home.

Rosemary's story highlighted a critical need in our veterinary hospital: an incubator. This vital piece of equipment provides the specialized care and controlled environment necessary for vulnerable newborns, just like Rosemary.

We are thrilled to share that we have successfully raised the funds needed to purchase a new incubator!

Summer Tips for Pets

Some Like it Hot, Your Pet Does NOT!

We all love summer with our pets, but heat can be dangerous—especially in cars. At just 75°F, a car's interior can hit 120°F in 30 minutes, even with windows cracked. Never leave pets in parked cars, even briefly. If you see a pet alone in a hot car, call Boulder Animal Protection at 303-441-3333.

Here are tips to keep your pets safe and happy all summer long:

- Ensure pets have a shaded area when spending time outside.
 Not much is better than lounging in the shade on a sunny day!
- 2. Always keep fresh, cool water available for your pet. Take it a step further and help your community cats by leaving water bowls out for them, too!
- 3. Learn the signs of heat stress and stroke. Knowing the early signs can be lifesaving on hot summer days! Pets with flat faces Pugs, Bulldogs and Persian cats are more sensitive to heat because of their anatomy and have a lower tolerance for heat exposure.
- 4. These boots were made for walking! Keep your pet's paw pads safe by using booties during walks. Test the sidewalk yourself place your hand on the pavement for 10 seconds, if it is too hot for your hand, it's too hot for bare paws!

It's warming up Colorado and we're all eager to get outside and enjoy nature! It's also time for ticks, fleas and mosquitoes to come out, and they love to be close to us and our pets. These pesky pests can transmit serious illnesses like heartworm, plague and tick fever.

Prevention is key!

- Keep the wildlife wild. Wild animals may seem cute and cuddly, but they can carry a host of parasites and even deadly viruses like rabies. Keeping your beloved pets (and yourselves!) safely distanced from wildlife is crucial.
- Protect your pets. There are a wide variety of effective preventative products available. However, some can be harmful if not chosen carefully, or interact poorly with other medications. Always consult your veterinarian to discuss the best, safest options for your pets.
- Found a tick? We have simple, safe removal steps and even a cool way you can help the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment keep us all healthy!


