## CEO

Dear Friends and Supporters,

As I reflect on the incredible year 2013 was for the Humane Society of Boulder Valley I continue to return to one common thread – *being the safety net for animals*. This past year presented many difficult opportunities for us to once again act as a safety net for the animals and their guardians in our community. Because of your support, we were prepared and ready to spring into action when the Boulder community needed us the most.

In early February, nine malnourished and under socialized malamutes arrived at our shelter after being rescued from a terrible hoarding case in Montana. Without hesitation our dedicated team of staff and volunteers sprang into action to provide the critical behavioral and medical care needed to give these animals the second chance they deserved. I am still in awe with the response we received from our community; you provided funding, food and open arms for these animals. *We could not have been the safety net for these animals in need without your incredible support.*

Our safety net held strong in September when one of the most devastating disasters our community has seen ravaged through our beloved city. Again, at a time when families were working to pick up the pieces destroyed by the flood waters, our community came together to provide the very safety net needed which allowed us to open our doors in a time of crisis. Because of the outpouring of support from our donors, we were able to provide families who had no place for their pets, the security of knowing a safe, comfortable shelter was available and ready to help.

Being the safety net for animals regardless of what need arises is a vital part of our mission. It is because of your steadfast support that we are able to build and maintain this high level of care and protection for each and every animal who comes through our doors and be ready to act in times of crisis, when our community needs us the most. Together we are building and strengthening relationships between pets and people.



# A POSITIVE TRAINING TAIL

When Whitney (now Ms. Pyggy) arrived at our shelter, she had been through a great deal of stress and was frightened of everyone and everything. She wouldn't approach anyone and had little interest in socializing. Our highly skilled team of trainers immediately enrolled Ms. Pyggy into our innovative behavior modification program and spent the next several weeks working with her to encourage her to trust and enjoy life again. Our team could soon start to see her happy personality peeking through, and volunteers, staff members and the public began to fall in love with the fun, spirited and sweet dog we saw inside. Now, Ms. Pyggy wiggles, wags and leans into familiar people and is enjoying life with her new family in Gunbarrel, CO.


In concert with our medical care, we are dedicated to the mental health of our animals as well. From kennel enrichment to protocols aimed at modifying an animal's behavior, these critical and innovative programs ensure we can safely and successfully place dogs and cats into new homes. Positive reinforcement is the foundation for all of our behavior programs. Our behavior modification program focuses on helping animals who are challenged by body handling, dog-dog aggression, fear, food care/object guarding, separation anxiety and litterbox issues. Techniques and protocols developed at our facility are now being used by shelters to save more lives all across the country.


# BY THE NUMBERS

A cornerstone of our mission is building and enhancing the relationships between pets and people. From adoptions to our lost and found services to resources dedicated to keeping pets with their guardians, this is our central theme. Each year 6,000 animals find a loving family of their very own through our adoption program. More than 1,300 lost and stray animals are safely returned to their families through our lost and found services. Fostering richer and stronger bonds with their pets, 1,600 guardians utilize the services of our training and behavior center. Our Veterinary Clinic ensures the health of 8,000 pets and provides families the resources and expertise to address any medical concerns so pets can live long happy lives.
