As the Chair of the Board of Directors of the Humane Society of Boulder Valley for the last three years, it has been eye opening to witness the magnitude of impact this organization has in our community and throughout Colorado. Not only does it serve as a leader in the animal welfare community but also a vital voice in our community reminding us, guiding us, and educating us on how to further enhance our relationships as guardians with our pets.

The Humane Society of Boulder Valley's ability to rehabilitate and revitalize the lives of nearly 7,000 animals each year is a true team effort. From repairing the physically wounded through comprehensive veterinary services to healing the emotionally wounded with behavioral modification and training, each animal is cared for as an individual story the moment they enter the organization's care. Shelter animals benefit from these services, but the community utilizes them as well. Nearly 5,000 guardians and their pets took a training class in 2014 and over 8,000 guardians utilized the veterinary services (not to mention hundreds of free or low-cost vaccinations that were administered). The transfer program brought in over 2,300 animals, allowing the organization to meet and fulfill the diverse needs of our community looking for their next family member.

It has been a true honor working alongside the staff, volunteers, donors, partners and Boulder Valley community who are dedicated to this incredible organization. As you read this report, I hope you also reflect on the ways the Humane Society of Boulder Valley has impacted you, your pet, our community and beyond.

Thank You

Because of your support of our innovative Shelter Medicine Program, we are able to provide lifesaving care to the animals coming through our doors and allow them to have a healthy new start. This program is the key to our ability to save more lives each year and vital to those animals like Oscar and Sochi, shown here.

We are dedicated to the mental health of our animals as well. Our Behavior Modification Program focuses on helping animals who face various challenges. We use a myriad of practices, including positive reinforcement and kennel enrichment techniques to shape positive animal behaviors. Positive reinforcement is the foundation for all our behavior programs. Techniques and protocols developed at our facility are now being used by other shelters to save more lives. These critical and innovative programs ensure we can safely and successfully place dogs and cats in new homes.

Shelter Medicine at Work

A matted and dehydrated puppy was found abandoned. His Good Samaritan named him "Oscar" and knew he needed medical care. It was discovered that he had a heart murmur and Patent Ductus Arteriosus (PDA). Oscar was brought to the Humane Society of Boulder Valley in the hopes we could repair his heart condition and find him a new home. We immediately transferred Oscar to Colorado State University (CSU) and its Saving Animals in Shelters through Teaching (SAST) program, where his heart was successfully repaired! This affectionate and sweet boy recovered in one of our foster homes before being adopted. Oscar is now living happily with his new family and two other dogs. His family reports that he and his siblings love sharing toys and playing in the sun!

A Positive Training Tail

Sochi was surrendered twice to HSBV. Our Training and Behavior Center knew they needed to give Sochi the tools to be successful in his next home, and soon realized this little cat had an outgoing personality and was a fast learner. With the use of our behavior modification program and positive reinforcement techniques, Sochi began to learn agility courses and how to use a cat exercise wheel. His adoption page featured videos of his new found skills, and he was highlighted in the announcement of our newly renovated Cat Adoption Center. One day his videos caught someone's eye! She hadn't planned on adopting, but had to meet this wonderful cat. It only took a few moments of playing before Sochi crawled into her lap and gave her a soft kitty kiss on the nose. It was a kiss that sealed the deal.

Now Sochi is happily living with two other cats and a dog, giving kisses and kitty hugs regularly to the other siblings. His new guardian loves working with Sochi on his agility courses and keeping his mind busy and his life happy. Sochi has a special bond with the guardian's three-year-old grandson, being the first to greet him when he arrives to visit Grandma.



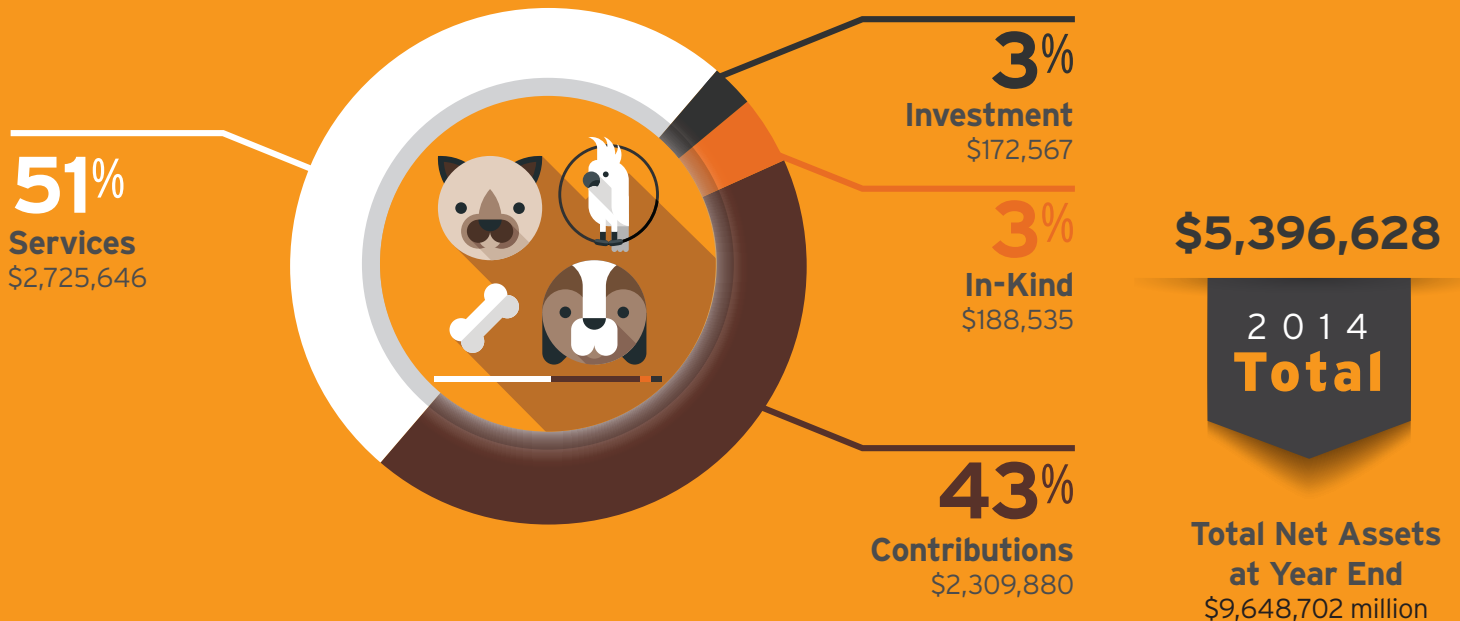

DEDICATED TO THE Healthy Relationships of Pets & People

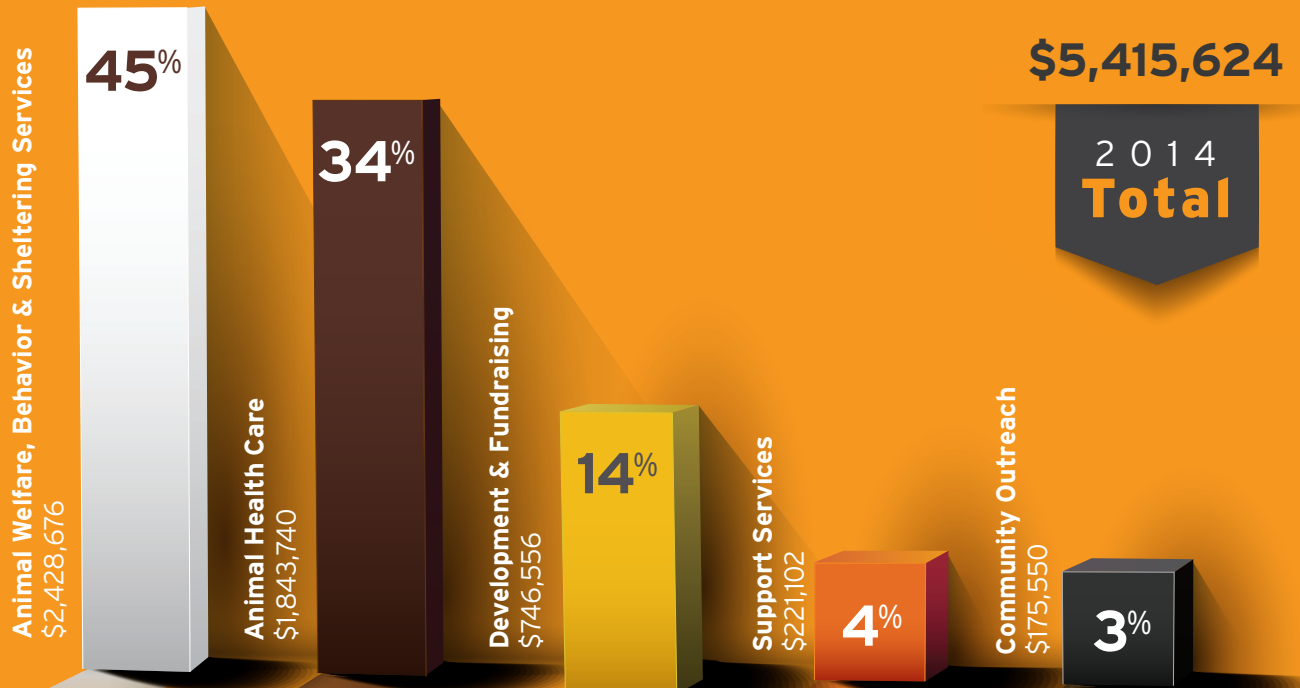

More than 800 lost and stray animals are safely returned to their families through our lost and found services. 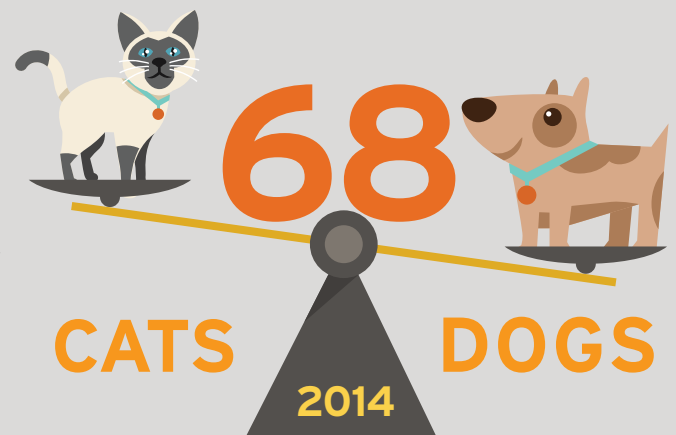

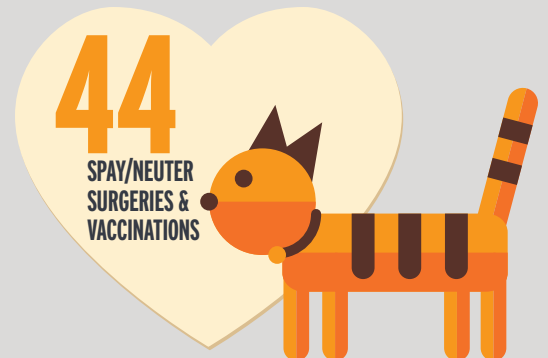
OUR FOOD SHARE PROGRAM

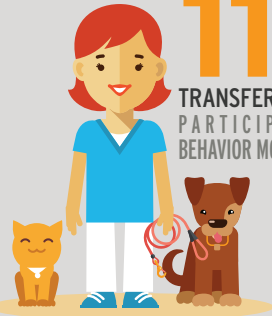

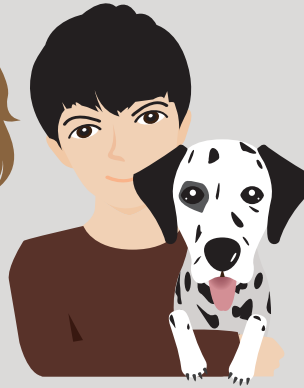
In 2014, 288 dogs and 222 cats were rehabilitated through our shelter's behavior modification program, and 115 transfer animals from other shelters participated in this program.

5,405 clients worked with our Training and Behavior Center to better understand how their animals learn and how to set those relationships up for success.

While the majority of our training center pet clients are dogs, we also offered nearly 85 private consultations for cat guardians to help with their pet's behavior concerns, a 16% increase from 2013.
