

DEDICATED TO HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS BETWEEN


Pets and People

Our mission is founded upon building and enhancing relationships between pets and people. Every day we work to build and strengthen these relationships, allowing them to thrive by providing support to sustain and protect them. From adoptions and lost and found services to dedicating resources to keep pets with their quardians in times of hardship, healthy relationships are the basis for everything we do. Last year, more than 5,000 animals found loving families of their own through our Adoption program. More than 800 lost and stray animals were safely reunited with their families through our Lost and Found services. Fostering richer and stronger bonds with their pets, over 3,000 guardians utilized the services of our Training and Behavior Center. Our Veterinary Clinic continued to ensure the health of over 6,000 pets, providing families with resources so their pets can live long, happy lives. Companion animals bring joy and love into the lives we share with them. Through these life-changing relationships, our lives are enriched and our community thrives.

Lives Saved BECAUSE OF YOUR SUPPORT

Raphael

Raphael went on an extraordinary journey to make his way to the Humane Society of Boulder Valley and his new home - he hitched a ride in the wheel-well of a truck all the way from Castle Rock to Broomfield! Poor Raphael was found when the driver arrived at his destination and heard him cry out for help. A compassionate Animal Control Officer knew Raphael needed immediate medical care and brought him to the HSBV Veterinary Clinic. Upon his arrival, our skilled veterinary team quickly and expertly treated the painful burns on his paws from his harrowing trip. Over the following three weeks, Raphael spent time in our clinic receiving the best care possible for his injuries - gentle foot-baths to heal his paws, specialized antibiotics to prevent infection, regular bandage changes to promote healing – and, of course, a lot of love from our caring staff and volunteers. Soon, Raphael was back on his feet and moved into our Adoption Center - comfortable enough to play, jump, and knead plenty of kitty biscuits. After a traumatic arrival at HSBV, Raphael was adopted by local family, and is now enjoying a much-deserved safe and happy home.



Hero

Hero's resilience and tireless spirit, along with compassionate support of many staff and volunteers, helped him overcome the challenges of his young life. In March of 2017, our Transfer program responded to a partner organization's request for support of this sweet lab mix. At 4-years of age, Hero had been diagnosed with a congenital disease that had progressively left him completely blind. When he came to HSBV, our Behavior Modification program worked in tandem with our skilled Shelter Medicine program to develop an individualized care plan for Hero, ensuring his mental and physical well-being during his time at HSBV and setting him up to thrive in his future home. Hero's blindness and new surroundings caused his anxiety to persist, requiring our Veterinary team to develop a unique treatment plan to ease his restlessness and calm his fears. Every day, Training and Behavior staff and volunteers worked with Hero to help him learn how to navigate his world without sight, build his confidence around new experiences, and reward his successes. Together, our teams supported Hero's needs and helped him thrive while he awaited his new beginning. After 6 months of continued intensive care, Hero's family finally found their new companion. A true Colorado dog, Hero now lives his dream life with his loving family in the mountains of the Front Range. Your dedication to pets like Hero is life-changing to pets in need and the people who love them.




